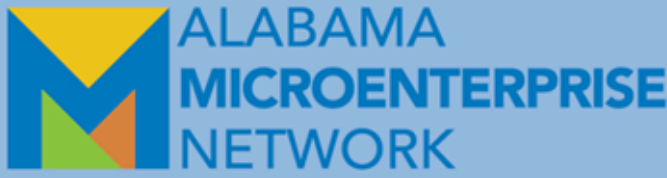

AMN is part of a community committed to the growth and development of microbusinesses

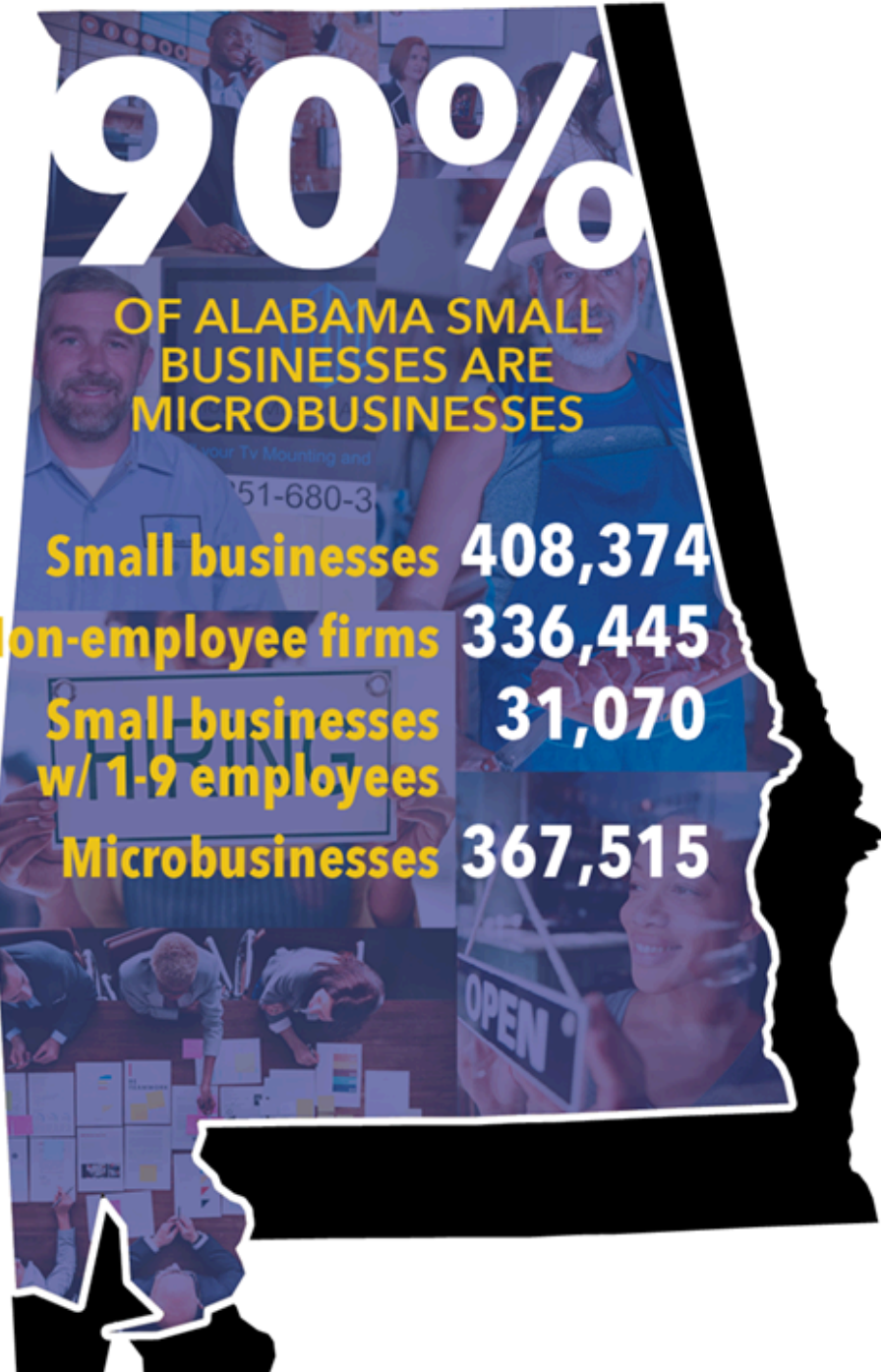
WHAT WE DO
